- Investigate different language families and select a language from a different family/branch
- If you have a friend/relative who speaks a language and you want to know more about that language, use that.
- If you hear of a language group in the news and would like to learn more, use that

If you need help finding a language to investigate, please ask. You will be asked questions on the problem sets and exams about your language, so please be prepared to answer them.
