1836	Studies law, philosophy, and history in Berlin
	Influenced by Hegel and young Hegelians
1841	Receives doctorate in philosophy from the University of Jena
1842	Settles in Bonn, writes for "underground newspaper"
1843	Marries Jenny von Westphalen, goes to Paris
1844	Writes what becomes "Economic and Philosophic Manuscripts of 1844"
	Comes under influence of French socialists. Becomes friends with Friedrich
	Engels
	Publishes The Holy Family
1845	Ordered to leave Paris
	Moves to Brussels
	Publishes The German Ideology
1847	Publishes <i>The Poverty of Philosophy</i>
1848	Publishes The Communist Manifesto
	Asked to leave Brussels
	Goes to Paris, then Cologne
	Becomes editor of revolutionary magazine
1849	Writes Labor, Salary, and Capital
	Asked to leave Germany
	Goes to Paris, then to London
1850	Publishes Class Conflict in France
1851	Becomes contributor to the New York Tribune
1852	Publishes The 18th Brumaire of Louis Bonaparte
1859	Publishes The Critique of Political Economy
1862	Stops writing for the <i>New York Tribune</i>
1864	Helps form the International Association of Workers
1867	Publishes Das Kapital, Volume I (of a proposed 10)
1869	Assured of annual income from Engels
1871	Publishes Civil War in France
1875	Publishes Criticism of the Gotha Program
1881	Death of Jenny Marx
1883	Dies and is buried in London
