THE PURITAN'S DILEMMA:

MARTIN LUTHER: The Secular Calling

All work is service to the Lord and contributes toward one's salvation. However, one is saved by Grace alone.

JOHN CALVIN: Predestination

If God is omniscient, He knows the future, and therefore He knows whether or not one will be saved or damned.

PURITAN ETHIC: Hard work and asceticism

The individual's task is to increase the glory of God, to do His will, and to fulfill His Commandments.

One must especially guard against being tempted into the sins of this life by the Devil.

Life is thus to be pure work, removed from distracting joy and pleasure, in the service of God.

THE FUNCTIONAL SOLUTION:

- Hard work produces wealth.
- Wealth is not to be squandered on indulgent sinful pleasures of the flesh but instead is a sign of success.
- Success is God's covert signal that you are a member of the Elect.
- Wealth, rather than being wasted, is re-invested in work, increasing productivity, thus increasing wealth and a greater sense of being Saved.
- The best way to do increase productivity \Rightarrow wealth \Rightarrow Saved is to be as RATIONAL as POSSIBLE.
