Consider the charms of the simultaneous
For and Against, the Perhaps,
the protracted reservation of the decision
which permits a foretaste of the enjoyment of both its aspects
which in their realization are mutually exclusive.

And famously:
Flirtation also does no more than play with reality, yet it is still reality with which it plays.
