A. The State of German at Oregon's High Schools and Colleges/Universities Presenter: Christian P. Stehr, Oregon State University

One of the main arguments made to justify closing down many language programs at high schools throughout Oregon over the last decade was that the Oregon University System institutions (all larger than any given high school) would continue to carry on the diversity in language offerings. That expectation, unfortunately, is no longer a reasonable one and German, in particular, is under assault at our state institutions of higher learning.

B. "Zertifikat Deutsch" now available in Oregon Presenter: Matthias Vogel, University of Oregon

UO first and second-year German language programs supervisor who tests for the Zertifikat Deutsch at the end of the third year, will talk about the ZD exam, the curriculum and the fact that ALL students can take it at the UO now (including OSU, Western, Southern, etc. students as well as high school students).

C. How Can Post-Secondary Help Struggling High-School German Programs? Presenter: William B. Fischer, Portland State University

For several years German faculty and grad students at PSU have been exploring outreach to endangered high-school German programs through use of technology such as two-way video connecting sufficient students, at several schools, to make upper-level high-school programs viable while the in-building teacher concentrates on maintaining and building program in German 1 & 2. The session presents about 10 features that have been considered, such as relation to curriculum standards, integration with the second-year college/university curriculum, and financial support. Session attendees will be asked to comment on the project.

D. German Teaching Resources in the Northwest.

Presenter: Blake Peters, Head of School, German American School of Portland
