Parts: initial small talk; read a dialog together; open-ended conversation (housing, neighborhood and transportation / routine)

Use the generic scoring guides for dialog reading and for performance with current material.

Look for true Intermediate behavior: maintaining conversation with single sentences, but sometimes beyond the level of just a single sentence – either a couple sentences or else initiates an exchange

Follow-ups with warum/wie for stronger performances, was/wann/wo for weaker ones, either-or choices for struggling ones

Part 1: Initial small talk

Habe Sie gute Kurse (Klassen) in diesem Semester?
Was ist Ihr längster Tag? bester Tag?
Was studieren Sie im Frühling(-s-semester)?

Part 2: read a dialog together – Use either K11 #4 or K12 #4, with student reading the left-hand column.

Part 3: Housing, neighborhood, transportation / routine

Localize them in their neighborhood: where they live, size of building (rooms, storeys, number of people / bathrooms). Try to elicit a sentence about someone ELSE who lives there, and then push for er/sie pronoun and 3S verb forms (remember the double-question technique: How old is X and what does he/she study?)

Then focus on EITHER food and hygiene or transportation:
