## 1 Computations

1. Consider the function  $g \in S_4$  given by

$$1 \mapsto 2$$

$$2 \mapsto 1$$

$$3 \mapsto 3$$

$$4 \mapsto 4.$$

Write down all functions  $f \in S_4$  with the property that

- (a)  $f \circ f \circ f = \text{id}_A$ ,
  - (b)  $f \circ g = g \circ f$ ,
  - (c)  $f \circ g = \text{id}_{\{1,2,3,4\}}$ .
  - (d)  $f(1) \in \{1, 2\}$  and  $f(2) \in \{1, 2\}$ .
2. How many elements  $(f, g)$  in  $S_3 \times S_3$  are there that satisfy  $(f, g)(f, g)(f, g) = (\text{id}_{\{1,2,3\}}, \text{id}_{\{1,2,3\}})$ ?

## 2 Proofs

- (I) Let  $A$  be a set and  $B$  any *finite* subset of  $A$ . Define

$$G = \{f \in S_A \mid \text{for all } b \in B, f(b) \in B\}.$$

Prove that  $G$  is a subgroup of  $S_A$ .

- (II) Define the set

$$G = \{f \in S_5 \mid f(2) = 3\}.$$

Is  $G$  a subgroup of  $S_5$ ? Prove your answer is correct.
