Dear Mr. Parry,

I write to express my dismay at Lexington Books' cancellation of the publication of Bruce Gilley's book, *The Last Imperialist*.

I know Bruce Gilley as a respected scholar and, among other things, co-author with me of *China's New Rulers* (New York Review Books, 2003).

Book publishers are in the front line in defending academic freedom. This is a heavy responsibility for Rowman & Littlefield, which is correctly described on your website as "a leading independent publisher ... with strengths in academic publishing in the humanities and social sciences."

I note that you have a publishing partnership with the Council on Foreign Relations, among other organizations. I'm especially conscious of the importance of your publishing decisions because I write the book review column on Asia and the Pacific for the Council's publication, *Foreign Affairs*.

When a publisher yields to pressure to reverse its decision to publish a book that has passed peer review and editorial review, it does great damage to the cause of academic freedom. I am sorry to say that I think you have done that in this case.
