## **Basic Course Format**

Each Thurs. : a biologist will present their research in a seminar talk.

## Course goals, Learning Objectives:

- Practice the art of explaining concepts we are familiar with and unfamiliar with.
- Listen to scientific research talks.
- Practice assessing scientific statements. Learn to differentiate between statements supported by strong evidence and those which are more speculative.
- Look up and read peer-reviewed, primary literature to critically address questions arising from scientific talks.

**Weekly Assignment**: Following the seminar, Please submit one question via CANVAS, (based on the material presented in the seminar) that you would like to ask the seminar speaker.

Grading: Weekly assignments 100%

## The rationale behind the assignment:

One reason for assigning the weekly question is to ensure that you attend the seminars, since you are taking the class for credit. Therefore, the question should reflect something on the material presented to show that you were there

The real purpose of seminars such as this are for faculty and graduates, and undergraduates to learn more about some of the ongoing research at other institutions. Sometimes they are collaborators, other times they may be working on topics similar to that of other faculty research here.

For the guest speaker, who has taken the time to travel to the university, meet with faculty (usually two days), and prepare their seminar, they assume the people in the audience are there simply because they wanted to learn more about the topic or science. Thus, it'ld be a bit rude to the speaker to take attendance in front of them, giving the impression (even if untrue) that you are there because you have to be there.

So... by submitting a question that relates to something the speaker said during the talk, I can tell you attended and can give you credit for it. Since its a pass/fail course, you should be safe as long as you dont miss more than two of the seminars

Your weekly question can be submitted in CANVAS (click quizzes or assignments). If you have ANY questions or concerns at all about the format, your grade, or just want to chat.... please don't hesitate to either jingle or email.
