

Oregon Health Care Interpreter Program Requirements

Oregon's Health Care Interpreter Program includes two levels of credentialing (qualification and certification). In order to become a qualified or certified health care interpreter you must meet all of the requirements listed below and provide all of the supporting documentation.

Oregon Health Care Interpreter Program Meeting the Language Proficiency Requirements for HCI Qualification and Certification

Oregon Health Authority approved language proficiency testing centers include:

Language Line University Passing level: high Intermediate or above Language Testing International Passing level: intermediate high or above

Equivalent language proficiency requirements set by the Oregon Health Authority include:

Oral proficiency in both English and the target language (L2) may be demonstrated by passing one of the following:

- National Board of Certified Medical Interpreters Certification test
- CCHI Medical Interpreter Certification test
- Oregon AHEC bilingual Spanish Interpreter Training program (if L2 is Spanish)
- Oregon Court Interpreter Certification test

Oral proficiency in English may be demonstrated by one of the following:

- Bachelor, Masters, PhD, or any other degree from any US institution of higher education.
- Graduation from any High School in an English language country or from an American School abroad.
- Graduation from a higher education institution abroad with English as the language of instruction
- One of the following tests (subject to change)
 TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): 570+ on paper; 230+ on computer version; 90+ on iBT.
 ELPT (English Language Proficiency Test): 950+

MELAB (Michigan English Language Assessment Battery) 80+ ECPE (Examination for the Certificate of Proficiency in English): PASS FCE (First Certificate in English, Level 3): A CAE (Certificate in Advanced English, Level 4): B CPE (Certificate of Proficiency in English, Level 5): B IELTS (International English Language Testing System) 7.0+

Oral proficiency in the target language(s) may be demonstrated by one of the following:

- Bachelor, Masters, PhD, or any other degree from an institution of higher education where target language is spoken
- Graduation from a high school of the country where target language is spoken
- Graduation from a US institution of higher education with a Major in target language
- ALTA Language Services oral and spoken language proficiency test; passing level high intermediate or above.
