Renewable Energy and Micro-development in Nicaragua Fall 2008 and Winter 2009 Tentative International Component Dates: December 26, 2008 – January 5, 2009 (Early registration deadline – Friday, September 12, 2008)

Program Faculty:

John Reuter, Environmental Sciences, PSU

Program Description:

This six credit undergraduate capstone is being offered in a 3+3 format, with students completing 3 credits of coursework during the fall term at PSU and an additional three credit, nine day, field experience in Nicaragua.

Students will learn about the environmental and technical characteristics for a range of small-scale, sustainable energy alternatives (photovoltaics, direct solar, micro-hydro and wind). Students will participate in an academic tour to Nicaragua and participate in a renewable energy community service project there. Students will also develop a proposal for funding and implementing community-based power generation that is suitable for submission to an NGO or local agency to fund continuing work.

In the first phase of the course, at PSU, students will address small-scale development of sustainable power that is environmentally "friendly" while also supporting community health and economic development. The second phase of the course is an academic tour of energy projects in Nicaragua. During this piece, students will travel around, mostly, rural parts of Nicaragua to see how various technologies have been employed and to talk to local agents of the government and NGOs about their successes and challenges.

Tentative Dates in Nicaragua

• December 26, 2008 – January 5, 2009.

Cost:

- Tuition and Program fee expenses are projected to be between \$2,650 \$3,755, depending on enrollment.
- Tuition and Program fee includes: Tuition and fees for the six credit course, accommodations and some meals in Nicaragua, mandatory overseas health insurance, mandatory Study Abroad fees and some faculty expenses.
- Not included: Roundtrip airfare; visa and immunization fees and personal expenses. Students should budget approximately \$1,800 for these additional costs.

Bring your completed application to the Office of International Affairs/Education Abroad Office, East Hall, 632 SW Hall, Room 101, or mail to Office of International Affairs, PO Box 751, Portland, OR 97207-0751. Typed applications are preferable.

Application Components:

- 1) **Transcripts:** (Unofficial transcripts are acceptable.)
 - a) All Students: Include transcripts for all courses taken at Portland State.
 - b) **Transfer Students:** Submit transcripts from your prior institutions for your last 90 credits of coursework attempted.
 - c) Graduate Students: Include transcripts for all graduate coursework attempted.
- 2) **References:** Please give the confidential reference forms provided in the application to someone who can objectively evaluate you. The reference should be from an instructor, however references from former instructors, an employer, youth leader, living group adviser, or counselor will also suffice. <u>Do not use peers or family friends as reference</u>. Please note that the reference form is to be returned to PSU in signed, sealed envelopes.
 - a) Undergraduate Students: Two references are required.
 - b) Graduate Students: One reference is required.

3) Interviews:

- a) **Undergraduate Students:** required to complete an in-person study abroad interview with Todd Waddell. Interviews will be scheduled after completed applications are received.
- b) Graduate Students: Interviews may be required at the discretion of the faculty director.
- 4) **Application Fee:** All students \$50.

Once your application file is complete, you will be notified when and with whom to arrange an appointment for a personal interview. A decision on your application will not be issued until all of the above components are received and your interview is completed. Please note that instructor approval is required and the final decision for acceptance will be made by the instructor AFTER you have completed your personal interview with an application committee in the Office of International Affairs.
