<u>Canvas:</u> The syllabus and Workbook also be made available through the Canvas learning management system (canvas.pdx.edu) following PSU login.

Course Description: This class is designed for students currently enrolled in an introductory geology class or who have taken such a course in the past. Enrollment is limited to 52 people. We will observe older and younger volcanic deposits on the north side of Mt St. Helens including those in the blast zone from the 1980 eruption, and see how the ecology of the region is recovering and what engineering challenges were faced following the eruption. During the pre-field trip class meeting students will be introduced to the geology of the Mt. St. Helens area. The Workbook must be turned in to the Instructor or TA no later than Friday 5 PM Oct 21 to be considered on time (it can be emailed as a PDF file that has been scanned), but most students should be able to turn it in before leaving the bus at the end of the field trip. Grades are P/NP only, determined on the basis of attendance for the pre-trip meeting (30%), attendance for the field trip (30%), and satisfactory completion of the workbook (40%). A minimum score of 70% is needed to pass the course; thus, attendance of both the pre-trip meeting and field trip are required to pass. Transportation costs are included in the registration fee.

What to bring on the field trip: Casual clothes, including rain gear and walking shoes, are appropriate for this field trip. Bring water, lunch, a copy of the Workbook and possibly a digital camera, and a small notebook and writing implement. And a phone if so inclined.

When do we leave? 7:30 AM Saturday Oct. 8. Meet near the corner of Broadway and Mill St, which is at the northeast corner of Cramer Hall, and look for a large bus. We have a long way to go and cannot afford to wait for late students, so get there with plenty of time in advance. Our scheduled return time is 6 PM at the same location.

<u>Communication:</u> email should be the primary means of contacting the Instructor or TA. This can be done with Canvas or through PSU gmail. As with all online communication, it is especially important to keep messages respectful.
