**Canvas:** For this online course, all course content will be delivered via the Canvas Learning Platform following PSU login.

**Course Description:** This one credit Pass/No Pass course is built on a series of videos produced by Stephen Carlson, who presents the geology of Mt. St. Helens in Washington state as an online virtual field study. It is an online version of a field trip that starts from near the Columbia River and moves to higher elevations at the base of the mountain on the north side. Students will watch video content, review a Powerpoint presentation, and peruse web resources to summarize content of the "geology stops", and to assess the hazards of the volcanoes in the Cascades mountain range, thereby gaining an understanding of the geology of Mt. St. Helens and other Cascade volcanoes, and what risks they pose to society.

**Assignment:** Students will complete an assignment that is due at 5:00 PM EST Dec. 2. The details of the assignment can be found from the Assignments Module in Canvas. Students will use the same module to submit their assignment.

**Communication:** Use the Canvas Inbox to send messages to you instructor or TA.
